- Julius Caesar introduced in Roman Empire 2,000 years ago
- Created to keep calendar in adjustment with earth's movement around sun
- Gregorian calendar has 365 days
- Every 4 years a day is added to keep calendar balanced

↑ Information can be interchangeable ↓

- After 100 years - calendar would be off 24 years
- Julian calendar had too many Leap years
- Gregorian calendar started 1582
- Century years are not Leap years unless they can be evenly divided by 400.

Leap years are needed every 4 years so Gregorian calendar can catch up to solar year.
